Director of Music Search Committee Update

The Director of Music Search Committee continues to make good progress toward finding a new Director of Music upon Dan Hibbett's retirement at the end of May. During January and February, the committee reviewed applications and selected eleven individuals to interview through Zoom. Based on the applicants' responses and reference checks, we selected four individuals that we believed matched the qualifications required by the job description and the wants of the St. Luke congregation as expressed in the surveys the committee administered in December. The four selected candidates were invited to visit St. Luke for the next phase of the interview.

The second phase of the interview process included on-site interviews by the clergy and by our children's ministry leader. The candidate also attended a rehearsal of each musical group that meets on a regular basis (Handbells, Modern Worship Team, and Rejoice Choir) and directed a musical piece during a portion of the rehearsal. Representatives from the Search Committee and Personnel Committee also met with the candidate to get a sense of the individual and how he or she might work within our congregation. Everyone who met with the candidate or observed his or her musical conducting was invited to complete an online questionnaire.

Two candidates have completed this second phase of the interview process, and we have two more scheduled for late April and early May. The Search Committee hopes to have a candidate selected to present to the Personnel Committee by mid-May. We appreciate the time that our pastors, staff members, musical groups and committee members have devoted to finding our next Director of Music.

The Women of St. Luke will observe "Rachel's Day"

What is Rachel's Day? In 1994, one woman urged her congregation, Bethel Lutheran Church on the west side of Chicago, to support children facing violence. They began by clearing a vacant lot and turning it into a garden— Rachel's Garden. It became a place where folks—mostly mothers—could come to mourn children killed by gun violence in the past year. They also planted a white cross and flowers in remembrance of these young ones.

Two years later, the Metro Chicago Synodical Women's Organization brought a memorial to the Third Triennial Convention (1996) of Women of the ELCA to broaden awareness of the violence children face and actions to address it. The convention passed the memorial, resolving "That ELCA women encourage their congregations to recognize the first Sunday in May each year as Rachel's Day, based on Jeremiah 31:15–17 wherein Rachel grieved for her children, to mourn the loss of our children and to renounce the forces of evil and fear that plague our nation.

The original focus of Rachel's Day was and still is shining a light on gun violence against children. Marian Wright Edelman, activist for the rights of children and founder of the Children's Defense Fund, said,

"It's everywhere. Guns and violence are in every nook and cranny of America. Many children can get a gun quicker than they can get a book out of the library. That puts us all at risk."

Many may be reluctant to observe Rachel's Day because guns are a polarizing issue. Politics, personal views and societal attitudes make it so. Perhaps, Scripture can help you find common ground. In Matthew 2:16–18, we see that children have been objects of violence for thousands of years. Read verse 18. Rachel's actions can become the resolve we need to say, "Enough is enough." Rachel refused to be comforted, and Scripture implies that her weeping went on for a long time. Yes, many may believe that gun violence is part of our culture, and we can do nothing about it. But Rachel was not deterred. Her actions bore witness to the urgency and gravity of the situation and the need to take action.

After the 10:30 service, St. Luke Women are making plans that will offer resources and learning opportunities for each member of St. Luke:

The panel presentation and conversation circle that follows will begin at 11:45am in the Fellowship Hall with speakers providing information followed by questions and discussion. We will conclude at 1:00pm - ready to serve our community in the many ways we may need to support children and families with gun safety.

NEW KIOSK

Dear St. Luke Committee leaders/members/other possibly interested St. Luke members, after a decision from Pastor Patti and President Tim Grabe and a grant from our Trust Fund Committee, a new multi-sided, rotating/rolling, six foot grid panel display tower will soon be installed in the St. Luke narthex for interested St. Luke Committees (and other St. Luke-supported projects/advocacy groups authorized by Pastor Patti to post communications, opportunities to connect and serve, advocacy opportunities, upcoming events, etc. There will be plenty of space to divide the multiple panels into columns which will allow possibly up to five postings each. Hardware to hold paper notices will be provided and abundant. This new communication kiosk will require a few guidelines to assure that it is a positive addition to our church.

First, all submissions for possible display must be submitted prior to posting to Pastor Patti Welch for approval. **Second**, Committee Leaders/ authorized Committee Members must monitor postings at least monthly to assure communications are "fresh", timely, still pertinent. **Third**, after attending a St. Luke service, ideally a Committee Leader/Member would be briefly present at the kiosk to help promote postings, answer questions, explain programs/opportunities, etc.

Stay tuned for other guidelines if/as they are needed. I was the lead advocate for this new communication opportunity to the greater St. Luke Community and I'm excited to see if it is as useful as I hope it could be. Blessings to all. ~ David Medford



Social Concerns Update

Each year, the Social Concerns Committee provides a detailed report of benevolence gifts made on behalf of our congregation in the St. Luke Annual Report. Additionally, the Committee provides periodic updates in the monthly Messenger to let you know how your offerings budgeted to our Social Concerns ministries are helping to make God's transformative love tangible in our community.

Of the total benevolence budget for 2022, 60% is designated for expenditure by the Social Concerns Committee; 40% is designated for the ELCA Oregon Synod. For 2022, those amounts are, respectively: \$66,800 and \$44,700.

While we know exactly where and why we allocate your benevolence gifts through the Social Concerns Committee, we now have a recent report for FY2020 from the Oregon Synod about the use of your benevolence giving to the ELCA's larger mission.

We are grateful for this report, the first we have received from the Oregon Synod. While this report which follows is for FY 2020, it provides a very helpful overview. When we receive the FY2021 ELCA Oregon Synod report, we will share it with our congregation.

We invite you to read this FY2020 report which follows carefully, as it provides a more detailed overview of what "Mission Support" looks like for the ELCA church-wide ministries, and how your benevolence gifts to the Oregon Synod are shared.
