We kick off July celebrating the Independence Day of the United States of America. Had each state in the Union decided to simply do its own thing and forego collaboration, we might still be part of the British Empire today: the states had to do together what no state could do alone.

Unity is a theme in our scriptures this month, too. Ephesians acknowledges the profound differences between people, and yet speaks of Christ uniting disparate groups of people (in this case Jewish and Gentile people). In Mark's Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples out to minister, he sends them out in pairs: to people – at times two very different people – united under a common mission: the work of God, which includes the building of community with people from all walks of life, cannot be done solo.

How might we walk and serve together in the fellowship of Christ?

This has been a momentous month at St. Luke. **Sunday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> we voted decisively (191 in favor, 1 no, and 1 abstained) to become a Reconciled in Christ (RIC) church. Congratulations to Kristi Baack, Tammy Witcosky (chairs of the RIC Committee) and the entire team for leading us in this endeavor.** It was particularly exciting that Bishop Eaton was in attendance during our vote! Congratulations to Pastor Patti who celebrated her first year in ministry with us on June 1<sup>st</sup>. We are so blessed to have the leadership, ministry and preaching of both Pastor Patti and Pastor Beth!

During the month of June, your Council discussed the new CDC Guidelines regarding the re-opening of church. We continue to proceed cautiously to ensure the safety of our members, offering both in-person and live streamed worship. Our congregation continues to give generously of their time, talent, and finances. A shout out to Dan Gott and his painting team who gave our Fellowship Hall and adjacent classrooms a much-needed color upgrade. To our confirmands who participated in the Rite of Confirmation on May 30<sup>th</sup> and shared their faith statements as devotions. And, to our congregation who's healthy giving supports the work of our church and community. We had a budget surplus of \$949.82 for the month of June.

Our *Courageous Conversations of the Heart* team continues to have conversations with St. Luke members around the topic of healthy giving. ## Social Concerns Committee Update

### Reconciling in Christ Vote on May 23, 2021 and initial annual gift to Reconciling Works through Social Concerns Committee

In the FAQ section of the Reconciling in Christ document thoughtfully crafted by the RIC Committee and presented in advance of the May 23 congregational meeting, a significant question was posed: "If we vote to become RIC, how will we affirm that we are welcoming?" Among much else, the final sentence reads: "St. Luke will make an annual contribution to support the national RIC program."

Because we voted overwhelmingly to become an RIC congregation, we thus agreed to make a contribution to support [Reconciling Works](#) (i.e. the national RIC program). At the June 1 meeting of the Social Concerns Committee, members voted unanimously to allocate \$1000 to Reconciling Works as a "partner congregation" for 2021, communicating this decision to the RIC co-chairs, Tammy Witcosky and Kristi Baack, and to Council President Karen Stabeno.

Because this is a mid-year (after annual budget) decision, it makes sense to initially fund our congregation's annual gift through the Social Concerns Committee this year through remaining discretionary funds that we allocate to our Advocacy Ministry Outreach. That being said, our Committee also recommended to Church Council that an annual gift be considered as a line item in the congregational budget for 2022 and beyond, as the decision regarding amount of gift is then made by the entire congregation. If, in the judgment of the Council, that gift should be paid from the Social Concerns budget, that is a Council decision that would be communicated to and carried out by the SC Committee.

If there's a bottom line, this is not about the amount of the annual gift or where it "lives" in our congregation's budget. Rather, it's about our congregation annually reinforcing the importance of our partner relationship with Reconciling Works as well as with other RIC congregations around the country, and what we can learn from them. It keeps this important decision "front and center" as we affirm our welcome in a variety of ways.
