“But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ...” ~ Ephesians 2:4-5

What is your story? What have been times of great joy? Times of great heartache? Who has stood beside you? Where have you felt peace? Where have you met God? If you have ever had someone truly and lovingly listen to you as you answered any of these questions – even if the God question wasn't one of them – you have experienced a holy moment. Our stories – especially our deepest stories – matter to us. And, as Christians, we believe that they matter to God, to the point that God would choose to enter our story as a human being, would be willing to die for us, and would break death in order to bring love and hope into the darkest chapters of our own stories.

Over the next couple of months, we will focus on storytelling: at our Feed the Teachers gathering (Sunday, Aug. 26) principal Kristin LeMon will equip teachers to better share scripture and faith stories. Our October Wednesday Church Night will feature a “The Moth” style storytelling event. In our narthex, you are invited to write a short story or memory of Pr. Knapp and one of St. Luke. Our Council & Staff Retreat will feature a story-telling time. I invite you: find an opportunity to listen to a bit of someone else's story, and also find an opportunity to share a bit of your own faith story with someone else – a family member, a neighbor, someone at St. Luke. Feel free to stop by and talk with Pr. Joel or me about your story.

As we share our stories, and as we discover how God's love story for us connects with our stories, our story as St. Luke can grow richer and deeper, and we can prepare for some powerful future chapters together.

What's happening in the transition?

As the Transition Pastor I am getting familiar with the “goings on” of St. Luke and with the people. It's summer so people go on vacation – which is true for the Staff and Council members – and that slows down some of the transition process. All the rest of the activities here at St. Luke are happening and moving along – as you can see on the calendar. And the start of school and the program year here at St. Luke are coming in September.

I will be engaging the Council and Staff in conversations about the shape and size of St. Luke. I will be looking around for a few people to volunteer on a Transition Task Force (TTF). I'm hoping the TTF will be able to get started in September or October. This group will help facilitate some congregational conversation and lead us in refining our answers to: Who is St. Luke? Who are our neighbors? What might God be calling us to do?

Some things have changed since you last had congregation-wide conversations preceding the call of Pastor Beth. Your Senior/Lead Pastor took a different call, you added on to the Narthex (Gathering area), and you recently rearranged the Sunday morning schedule.

So, the questions and conversations will be slightly different. Think about the congregation as a very large mobile that has had some pieces removed or changed. With those changes the mobile will rebalance itself. That rebalancing takes some time and during that time other pieces will shift. That's what is happening. You may not be aware of it so much or you might sense it in a more general way. It is happening – sometimes even unconsciously.

This also means that we can also be intentional about how things settle out. We can give the Spirit room to work and we can use our spiritual gifts to work things out as well. We can give some space for grieving. We may experience openings for new service or ways to contribute.

There is often anxiety associated with these changes, shifting and settling. We can be assured that God is working to align things for the mission of St. Luke to remain strong and steady.

It may not look like much is happening in the transition and yet ...

Remember, as I said in my sermon last Sunday, let's dare together to send our roots deeper into God's love in Jesus Christ and see what happens then!

Two renowned Bonhoeffer scholars will join in presenting a special lecture event in August. The **Rev. Dr. Renate Wind** from Heidelberg, Germany will speak on the theme “Bonhoeffer: The Man, the Myth, and the Martyr” and **Rev. Dr. Mark Bocker** of Beaverton will present “For Love of the World: Bonhoeffer’s Theology of Resistance and of Hope”. Co-sponsored by Pacific Lutheran University and Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, there will be a reception hosted by PLTS Rector Ray Pickett at both events which are free to the public.

About The Speakers:

Renate Wind is a Lutheran pastor who served as professor of biblical theology and church history at the evangelical university in Nuremberg. She is a well-known Bonhoeffer scholar and was awarded the prestigious German “Evangelical Book Award” in 1993 for her landmark biography, *Dietrich Bonhoeffer: A Spoke in the Wheel*. Dr. Wind has lectured extensively in Europe and North America; and has recently published her newest book, *Being Christian in the Empire: Following Jesus as Vision of Another World*.

Mark Bocker is the lead pastor at St. Andrews Lutheran in Beaverton and past president of the International Bonhoeffer Society. He has taught courses in theology and ethics at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. Bocker’s doctoral dissertation was on Bonhoeffer’s ethics of responsibility. He was the volume editor for *Conspiracy and Imprisonment: 1940-1945*, volume 16 of *Dietrich Bonhoeffer Works* and co-editor for *Ecumenical, Academic and Pastoral Work: 1931-1932*, and *Theological Education at Finkenwalde: 1935-1937*. He is the author of the book *Coming Home to Earth*.
